Police Activity Summary:

Westgate area (beat 48):

288 police calls for service were generated during 2017 in the patrol beat. 8 of those calls were for actual crimes. The rest of the police calls are considered quasi-criminal, traffic, and service-related.

Pembroke Oaks area (beat 49):

320 police calls for service were generated during 2017 in the patrol beat. 10 of those calls were for actual crimes. The rest of the police calls are considered quasi-criminal, traffic, and service-related.

Pembroke area (beat 50):

290 police calls for service were generated during 2017 in the patrol beat. 13 of those calls were for actual crimes. The rest of the police calls are considered quasi-criminal, traffic, and service-related.

Prairie Oaks area (beat 64):

518 police calls for service were generated during 2017 in the patrol beat. 28 of those calls were for actual crimes. The rest of the police calls are considered quasi-criminal, traffic, and service-related.
