


What Our Neighborhood Watch is Not



1. Target Hardening

"Making targets more resistant to attack."

- Doors, windows, shutters, screens
- Sliding glass doors
- Door and window locks
- Alarm
- Fencing systems
- Lighting
- CPTED concepts









2. Target Removal

"Permanent or temporary removal of vulnerable property."

- "Lock, Take, Hide"
- Remove car keys and lock the parked vehicle
- Removing electronic devices from parked cars
- Hide valuables in a secure location out of sight
- Safety deposit boxes
- Home safes?









3. Obstruct the Means

"Making materials capable of being used to help a criminal commit a crime inaccessible."

- Eliminate tools or similar equipment
- Landscape rocks
- Dark/blind spots











4. Reduce the Payoff

"Reducing the gain if a crime is committed."

- Master bedroom; the first place they go
- Keep cash/jewels/valuables in your home to a minimum
- Get creative with hiding places
- Safety deposit box









5. Access Control

"Restricting access to sites, buildings or parts of sites and buildings."

- Door/window locks (and making sure doors/windows are shut)
- Combination locks
- Family rules









6. Visibility/Surveillance

"Making sure criminals would be visible if they carried out a crime."

Three types of surveillance:

Natural: modifying the existing surroundings to increase visibility

• Formal: technology to deter and identify actual or potential offenders

Informal: the community being encouraged to be vigilant and knowing

what to do when they see potential risk











7. Environmental Design

"Changing the environment of a location to reduce opportunities for committing crime."

- Lighting
- Landscaping
- Passive or aggressive blockades
- Walkway and Driveway Layout









8. Rule Setting

"The introduction of expectations that detail acceptable household safety standards."

- Locking vehicles
- Keeping garage doors closed when not in use
- System maintenance (lighting, locks, alarm, communication, etc.)
- Establish and maintain a safety mindset in the home









9. Increase the Chance of Apprehension

"Anything that increases the risk of a criminal being caught."

- Relationships within the neighborhood
- Develop a culture of safety
- Eyes and Ears
- Proper management of CCTV and alarms
- Lighting
- Making sure security equipment operates properly









10. Deflect Offenders

"Diverting offenders and potential offenders from committing crime."

- Working with young people/offenders to influence standards
- School Resource Officers
- Neighborhood/Community Policing
- School educational programs
- Drug and alcohol addiction treatment/services
- Vocational training and job placement programs
- Faith community
- Family stability
