**Gurnee, IL** – After a 25 year career with the Village of Gurnee Police Department, Deputy Chief Sandra Campbell is retiring effective January 6<sup>th</sup>, 2018.

Deputy Chief Campbell started her career in July 1992. After graduating from the State Police Academy, she was assigned to the patrol division. In 1996, she was assigned to investigations, and promoted to the rank of Sergeant in 1999. In 2011, she was promoted to the rank of Commander in the patrol division. In 2014, she was promoted to Deputy Chief overseeing patrol and investigations operations. In 2016 she became Deputy Chief of support services.

In addition to her service to the police department, Deputy Chief Campbell is very active in the community. She currently serves as Vice-President of the Board of Directors at the Zacharias Sexual Abuse Center in Gurnee and for many years as a volunteer domestic violence victim advocate for A Safe Place.

Although she has no solid plans for her future, Sandra plans to remain in Gurnee and spend more time pursuing one of her deepest passions, golf.
