### Mayor's Message

Dear Residents,

It is hard to believe that summer is over and we are into the fall season already. While summer passed quickly, we had several significant accomplishments. We held our new East Grand Farmers & Artisans Markets in July, August and September, with our fourth market scheduled for October 21st. We are pleased by the overwhelming support and attendance from the community and I am very appreciative of Village Staff for their dedication to its success and the many hours of extra effort put forth.



We finished up two large capital projects over the last few months: The reconstruction of the length of Almond Road and the installation of a roundabout to slow and calm traffic in the area. The total project cost was approximately \$1.1 million dollars and we should get 25 years of life out of the new roadway. While there was initially some angst over the installation of a roundabout, we've been continuously monitoring the intersection and traffic is flowing smoothly. Residents have begun to give us positive feedback as everyone becomes familiar with the intersection. As part of our long-term planning, a water pumping station will soon be installed along Almond Road in anticipation of the construction of the new water tower on Rollins Road. All this work is possible due to local shopping and the ½ percent sales tax that is dedicated to infrastructure improvements. We continue moving forward on the update to our Comprehensive Land Plan including a market study for a specific area of the Village that we feel could have potential for uses that would complement our existing tourism and shopping venues and produce revenues that will keep us in a strong position to continue to operate without a property tax.

As we get underway with preparation for snow and ice control, I can't stress enough how important it is to sign up for our weekly e-newsletter or to follow us on Facebook or Twitter (look for the blue check to avoid less reliable sources). We also post regularly on NextDoor. With so much going on in the areas of public safety, community development and public works, it is our first and best method to communicate timely and important information to our residents and businesses. The Village Board and I want to make sure that everyone is kept informed and that we are accessible to those we serve.

## Leaf Collection Program to Begin the Week of Monday, October 22nd

The Village offers an annual leaf collection program through its contract with Waste Management. Through this program, residents have the ability to dispose of leaves that accumulate in their yards during the fall season.

Gurnee's annual Leaf Collection Program begins Monday, October 22nd and runs until Friday, November 30th. Waste Management will make six trips throughout the Village to collect leaves during this time period. Waste Management makes great effort to collect leaves along each Village roadway every week. However, factors such as weather or large volumes of leaves may slow down collection efforts.

Residents should have their leaves at the curb by 6:00 a.m. on the Monday of each collection week to ensure they are collected. Leaf collection does not necessarily take place on the same day as your regular garbage pick-up. A leaf collection map has been posted to the Village's website for your reference: www.gurnee.il.us/residents/recycling/leaf-collection. Please note that this map assumes normal conditions for pickup and is subject to change based on collection volume and weather.

Residents should rake leaves to the curb where the vacuum trucks will collect them. When placing the leaves at the curb, please do NOT put them in the street as this may block culverts or storm sewer openings. Leaves piled in these areas may create drainage problems in the event of heavy rains or melting snow. Do NOT place leaves in plastic bags.

Residents with limited street frontage, such as those who live on cul-de-sacs, should continue to rake leaves as close to the curb as possible. If you are concerned you will not have enough room to place all the leaves, you can place them in kraft-type paper bags and dispose of them through the regular landscape collection service. However, if you do not subscribe to the service, you will need to purchase landscape stickers to affix to the kraft-type bags.

Once the collection truck makes its final run in your neighborhood, it will not return to collect any additional leaves. Residents with leaves after the final run during the week of Monday, November 26th will need to make alternate arrangements for pickup.

The Village requests that residents contact the Village prior to the final collection week with any concerns or issues so that they may be adequately addressed prior to the close of the program. For any questions, please contact Village Hall at (847) 599-7500.



Plan ahead: Get leaves to the curb on Monday to avoid missing pickup.



Compost: Leaves can make an excellent compost for plants in the spring.



Don't place leaves in the street: Leaves can clog sewers and make roads hazardous if wet.



Don't wait until the last minute: Make sure to put leaves out each week to prevent service slowdowns.



## Seasonal Reminders

Change Your Clock and Your Battery

Daylight Savings ends on Sunday, November 4th. Don't forget to turn your clocks back an hour before bed on Saturday, November 3rd. As this date approaches, the Village of Gurnee Fire Department would like to



remind all residents to change the batteries in their smoke alarms when they turn their clocks back one hour. Changing the batteries in your smoke alarm is a simple task that can save lives.

In the United States, smoke alarms are present in 96% of American homes, but 20% do not work because of worn or missing batteries, preventing families from achieving the full potential of increased fire safety from smoke alarms. If a fire occurs, working smoke alarms cut the risk of dying in a home fire nearly in half by providing



an early warning and extra critical seconds to escape. Approximately 84% of fire deaths occur in homes where smoke alarms are not working.

#### Leaf Burning Prohibited

As a friendly reminder, the Village prohibits burning landscape waste. This ban includes leaf burning, the burning of brush, landscape waste or construction materials and large bonfires.

The Village does allow residents to create small, outdoor wood burning fires. The ordinance permits residents to use portable outdoor fire pits and build small wood burning campfires. 

### Is Your Mailbox Ready for Winter?

With the winter quickly approaching, residents are reminded that mailboxes must be properly positioned. In late October, plow trucks will drive through snow routes, making note of right-of-way hazards and improperly placed, leaning or damaged mailboxes. Residents with mailboxes having these issues will be sent a letter asking for their cooperation in bringing the mailbox into compliance with USPS standards.

Residents who receive a letter and fail to repair the mailbox will not be eligible for reimbursement of damage caused by snow and ice control operations. If you have questions regarding your mailbox placement, please contact Public Works at (847) 599-6800.

Child Safety Seat Recycling

Due to recycling centers no longer accepting plastic shells from car seats, the Gurnee Police Department is no longer able to provide car safety seat recycling for residents. With no other available sites in Illinois for accepting child safety seat shells, the Gurnee Police Department advises residents with expired or unneeded child safety seats to cut the straps on the seats and place them as a bulk item with their weekly garbage pickup.
