



Recreational Cannabis Sales

On June 25, 2019, Governor Pritzker signed into law the Cannabis Regulation and Tax Act, making Illinois the 11th state to legalize recreational cannabis sale and use. The Act provides for the State licensure of a variety of adult-use cannabis business establishments, preserves the legalization of medical cannabis and includes a provision allowing "home grow" cannabis by medical cannabis program participants only. Recreational marijuana use by adults 21 and over will become legal on January 1, 2020. Municipalities may not restrict the private consumption of cannabis as authorized by the Act. The Act does however prohibit the use of cannabis in public places, schools and childcare facilities among other locations. Municipalities may adopt and enforce local ordinances to regulate possession and public consumption of cannabis so long as the regulations and penalties are consistent with the Act.

The State of Illinois is allowing municipalities to decide whether to prohibit recreational cannabis businesses from locating in their communities or to allow these type of uses subject to local zoning restrictions. In addition to granting or restricting the authority of adult-use recreational dispensaries, municipalities have the option of authorizing on-site consumption of cannabis (i.e. cannabis cafes / smoke lounges), as well as the collocation of craft growers, infusers and cultivation centers.

The Village of Gurnee is seeking feedback from residents regarding whether to potentially ban the sales of recreational cannabis, or allow them via ordinance. To gather opinions, the Village has an online survey available at: www.surveymonkey.com/r/GurneeRecCannabisSurvey or in person at Village Hall (325 N O'Plaine Road).

Additionally, a by-phone survey will be sent to all residents in the Connect CTY system at 7:00 p.m. on Wednesday, October 9th at 7:00 p.m. The survey will ask:

"Would you support allowing recreational cannabis dispensaries to operate in the Village of Gurnee?

Press 1 if you strongly support allowing recreational cannabis dispensaries in Gurnee Press 2 if you somewhat support allowing recreational cannabis dispensaries in Gurnee Press 3 if you somewhat oppose allowing recreational cannabis dispensaries in Gurnee Press 4 if you strongly oppose allowing recreational cannabis dispensaries in Gurnee

If you would like to provide further thoughts on the issue and have not already completed the online survey, please visit the Village's website at gurnee.il.us to complete the survey and provide comments."

Leaf Collection Program to Begin the Week of Monday, October 21st

The Village offers an annual leaf collection program through its contract with Waste Management. Through this program, residents have the ability to dispose of leaves that accumulate in their yards during the fall season.

Gurnee's annual Leaf Collection Program begins **Monday**, **October 21st and runs until Saturday**, **November 30th.** Waste Management will make six trips throughout the Village to collect leaves during this time period. Waste Management makes great effort to collect leaves along each Village roadway every week. However, factors such as weather or large volumes of leaves may slow down collection efforts.

Residents should have their leaves at the curb by 6:00 a.m. on the Monday of each collection week to ensure they are collected. Leaf collection does not necessarily take place on the same day as your regular garbage pick-up. A leaf collection map has been posted to the Village's website for your reference: www.gurnee.il.us/residents/recycling/leaf-collection. Please note that this map assumes normal conditions for pickup and is subject to change based on collection volume and weather. It is recommended you place leaves out as early as possible to account for snow that can disrupt the program in late November.

Residents should rake leaves to the curb where the vacuum trucks will collect them. When placing the leaves at the curb, please do NOT put them in the street as this may block culverts or storm sewer openings. Leaves piled in these areas may create drainage problems in the event of heavy rains or melting snow. Do NOT place leaves in plastic bags.

Residents with limited street frontage, such as those who live on cul-de-sacs, should continue to rake leaves as close to the curb as possible. If you are concerned you will not have enough room to place all the leaves, you can place them in kraft-type paper bags and dispose of them through the regular landscape collection service. However, if you do not subscribe to the service, you will need to purchase landscape stickers to affix to the kraft-type bags.

Once the collection truck makes its final run in your neighborhood, it will not return to collect any additional leaves. Residents with leaves after the final run during the week of Monday, November 25th will need to make alternate arrangements for pickup.

The Village requests that residents contact the Village prior to the final collection week with any concerns or issues so that they may be adequately addressed prior to the close of the program. For any questions, please contact Village Hall at (847) 599-7500.



Plan ahead:Get leaves to the curb on Monday to avoid missing pickup.

Don't place leaves in the street: Leaves can clog sewers and make roads hazardous if wet.



Don't wait until the last minute: Make sure to put leaves out each week to prevent service slowdowns.



Seasonal Reminders

Change Your Clock and Your Battery

Daylight Savings ends on Sunday, November 3rd. Don't forget to turn your clocks back an hour before bed on Saturday, November 2nd. As this date approaches, the Village of Gurnee Fire Department would like to



remind all residents to change the batteries in their smoke alarms when they turn their clocks back one hour. Changing the batteries in your smoke alarm is a simple task that can save lives.

In the United States, smoke alarms are present in 96% of American homes, but 20% do not work because of worn or missing batteries, preventing families from achieving the full potential of increased fire safety from smoke alarms. If a fire occurs, working smoke alarms cut the risk of dying in a home fire nearly in half by providing



an early warning and extra critical seconds to escape. Approximately 84% of fire deaths occur in homes where smoke alarms are not working.

Leaf Burning Prohibited

As a friendly reminder, the Village prohibits burning landscape waste. This ban includes leaf burning, the burning of brush, landscape waste or construction materials and large bonfires.

The Village does allow residents to create small, outdoor wood burning fires. The ordinance permits residents to use portable outdoor fire pits and build small wood burning campfires. 
Shop Local

- Beer Pass + Park Admission \$60. Includes everything in the Beer Pass, in addition to General Admission access for Six Flags Great America.



Is Your Mailbox Ready for Winter?

With the winter quickly approaching, residents are reminded that mailboxes must be properly positioned. In late October, plow trucks will drive through snow routes, making note of right-of-way hazards and improperly placed, leaning or damaged mailboxes. Residents with mailboxes having these issues will be sent a letter asking for their cooperation in bringing the mailbox into compliance with USPS standards.

Residents who receive a letter and fail to repair the mailbox will not be eligible for reimbursement of damage caused by snow and ice control operations. If you have questions regarding your mailbox placement, please contact Public Works at (847) 599-6800.

Village Update

As we've entered fall and it will soon be winter, the Village of Gurnee and other agencies including the Illinois Department of Transportation and the Lake County Department of Transportation, have a number of construction projects in Gurnee that will affect local traffic patterns and improve infrastructure:

- Delany Road Closure: Delany Road is currently closed from Old Grand Avenue to US-41 for the replacement of a water main. Detour signs are up and on display. Delany Road will remain closed for the duration of the construction project, with current estimates for completion in November.
- Knowles Road Water Tower: The water tower construction crew is currently beginning the process to paint to tower. There is a large "curtain" being lifted into place around the tower during construction to protect the paint from dust. The painting project will last approximately 12 weeks and is highly weather dependent. The water tower is being built to increase overall capacity of our entire system and increase water pressure for customers on the western limits of Gurnee. - Union Pacific Railroad at US-41/Grand Ave Bridge Construction: IDOT is anticipating having the redesigned steel completed by late 2019/2020 at which time the new structure can be erected. Work would restart on IL 132 once the train traffic is switched over and the temporary bridge demolished. The US-41 exit ramp widening may take place ahead of the steel; however, construction will likely be delayed until the temporary bridge is removed.
