MAYOR'S MESSAGE

Dear Residents,

Summer will soon be here and so will the opportunity for us to enjoy all that the outdoors has to offer. One of my goals when I was elected Mayor was to increase opportunities for our residents to get outside and enjoy meeting other residents and the amenities in Gurnee. The Village's partnership with the Park District has produced many opportunities that I look forward to continue to grow. Holiday Lights (around Christmas) and Bonfires and Brews (now offered in both the Spring and the Fall) have been two of the recent additions to the many activities in the Village, headlined by the ever-popular Gurnee Days in August.

Additionally, the Village encourages neighborhoods to have block parties by offering a visit from both the Police and Fire Departments. I would like to add an extra block party incentive by offering those that qualify a block party grant. These funds would assist in buying food and inflatables and more. Attending a block party is a great way to get to know those that live around us. More information will be made available soon on how to obtain a block party grant for your neighborhood.

I appreciate the neighborhoods in town and how neighbors help each other out. I came across an example of this just a few months ago. In late February, we had a heavy rain that poured into Providence Village (a neighborhood located near the southwest corner of O'Plaine Road and Washington Street) causing some streets and yards to be filled with water. Over the years, Providence Village has experienced some drainage issues but this was larger than most events.

These rain events have raised concerns in the neighborhood and a group of residents from Providence Village contacted Village Hall to arrange a meeting with staff. A group of well-prepared residents came to Village Hall to present information, ask questions and seek a solution. The Village staff welcomed this approach and the Village Administrator, Engineer, Community Development Director, Streets and Utility Supervisors, Public Works Director and myself presented information about how the drainage system works in Providence Village, answered questions and most importantly listened to the residents about what they saw and experienced in late February.

The Village gained valuable information and so did the citizens. Rather than blame and discord, there was an atmosphere of community and cooperation. Basic information about calling the Police Department non-emgency line when a flooding event happens was shared and plans to lessen the impact of large rain events in the future were discussed as well as the implementation of those plans.

At Village meetings and in discussions with residents, I have found that difficult conversations have been addressed in very respectful ways as we both share our thoughts and look for solutions that will benefit all. I so appreciate the kindness of our citizens and their willingness to be patient and open to working with other neighbors, the Village Staff and myself. Thank you for that attitude in approaching your fellow neighbors and our Village staff. This attitude of community contributes to making Gurnee a great place to live.

I continue to pray that we enjoy all that God has given to us and to especially appreciate those that He has placed in our lives.

GURNEE CONSTRUCTION SCHEDULE

Street Resurfacing Program (May - October)

The Village's contractor, Payne & Dolan Inc., will be resurfacing 7.6 miles of roadway as well as completing pavement patching and curb and sidewalk replacement. The following streets will be resurfaced this year:

The public should expect to see impacts such as lane, sidewalk and temporary driveway closures throughout this project.



Route 21 Water Main Project (May to October)

The Village's contractor, Campanella & Sons, will be replacing water main along Route 21 from Grand Ave. to Prairie Oak Rd. Water outages are possible during this work. The Village will provide notice to residents if water will be out for a prolonged period of time. There will be temporary lane, driveway, and sidewalk closures.

<u>Dilley's Road Pedestrian Path (April to August)</u>

The Village's contractor, Everlast Blacktop, is installing an 8 ft. wide pedestrian path along the east side of Dilleys Rd. from Stearns School Rd. to the ComEd pedestrian path near the Pembrook Water Tower. There will be temporary lane, driveway, and sidewalk closures.

<u> Sidewalk Replacement Program (May - September)</u>

The Village's contractor, Everlast Blacktop, will begin sidewalk work in the general area of Kilbourne Rd. to eastern Village limits from northern to southern Village limits. Prior to the work beginning, the contractor will be providing door hangers to residents who will lose access to their driveways . There will be temporary lane, driveway, and sidewalk closures.

<u>O'Plaine Rd. & Kings Way North Crossing (Mid-Summer - Early Fall)</u>

The Village is working with the Lake County Division of Transportation (LCDOT) to develop plans to put a pedestrian crossing just north of the intersection of Kings Way North and O'Plaine Rd. There will be traffic delays and temporary lane closures.

<u> Stearns School Road and Rte. 41 Improvement (April - TBD)</u>

The Illinois Department of Transportation (IDOT) and LCDOT will be improving the intersection at Stearns School Rd. and Rte. 41. Additional turn lanes will be added from the E bound Stearns School to S bound Rte. 41 and from S bound Rte. 41 to W bound Stearns School Rd. There will be traffic delays and lane closures.

Hunt Club Rd. and Washington St. Intersection (Fall 2024 - 2025)

LCDOT will be expanding the intersection at Hunt Club Rd. and Washington St. They will be adding dedicated left and right turn lanes for all four legs of the intersection as well as installing a pedestrian path that will tie the existing Washington St. path to the Village's path, north to Dada Dr. There will be traffic delays and lane closures.

Route 120 & O'Plaine Rd. Intersection Improvement

IDOT and LCDOT are improving the intersection at O'Plaine Rd. and Rte. 120 by installing new traffic signals, pedestrian facilities, and improving the turn lanes for each leg of the intersection. IDOT will also be resurfacing the bridge deck over the Des Plaines River. There will be traffic delays and temporary lane closures.

LRS WASTE AND RECYCLING TRANSITION

Starting June 3rd, Lakeshore Recycling Systems (LRS) will begin residential waste and recycling collection for the Village. This change applies to residents who do not pay a homeowners association (HOA) for waste collection services. Here's what you need to know:

• Cart Distribution: Each residence will receive one LRS garbage cart and one LRS recycling cart. Residents who have a yard waste subscription will also received a LRS yard waste cart.

• Cart Delivery: Expect delivery of your new LRS carts between May 20th and May 27th.

• Weekly Collection: LRS will empty garbage and recycling carts once a week on your service day.

• Route/Service Day Changes: Minimal changes were made to optimize pick-up with only about 12% of service days changing. You should have received notice of your service day in the mail, however you can confirm your service day at gurnee.il.us/LRS.

• Yard Waste Stickers: New LRS yard waste stickers will be required after June 1st as Waste Management stickers will not be accepted.

• Billing: Your first bill from LRS, covering June, July, and August services, will arrive in mid-May. Billing will be quarterly in advance of services rendered.

• Transition from Waste Management: Waste Management will only empty their carts during the final week of service beginning Tuesday, May 28th. Do NOT put out new LRS carts during this week as they will not be serviced.

• Leave Waste Management Carts Empty: After Waste Management's final collection, leave their carts completely <u>EMPTY</u> at the curb until removal to avoid service issues.

Your Role During the Transition Timeline

New LRS Cart Delivery: Monday, May 20 - Monday, May 27 Be ready to accept the new carts and store until first week of pick up beginning, Monday June 3rd. The contractor will be delivering carts on Memorial Day, Monday, May 27th.

Last WM Service & Cart Removal: Tuesday, May 28 - June 1 Memorial Day is on Monday, May 27th. Therefore, beginning Tuesday, May 28th, LEAVE your WASTE MANAGEMENT carts empty at the curb. A contractor will pick up your WM cart. Failure to have your cart empty may result in service issues.

First Week of LRS Service: Monday, June 3 - Thursday, June 6 Have your Lakeshore Recycling Systems cart ready for first use of weekly collection.



Frequently Asked Questions Regarding the Transition

Why is the Village changing my garbage and recycling hauler?

The Village of Gurnee's agreement with Waste Management (WM) expires on May 31, 2024. Waste Management issued a statement that a renewal would include significantly higher rates in excess of 30% and with no fall leaf vacuum service. As the Village tries to keep rates down for residents and provide desired services, the Village issued a request for proposal. <u>The Village Board voted on and chose the lowest</u> of the only three bids received.

Will my garbage/service day remain the same?

Very minimal route service day changes were made to optimize pick up. It's likely that your service day will remain the same. However, please read your letter or view the map at gurnee.il.us/LRS.

How will the landscape waste collection subscription/sticker program work throughout this transition?

Residents who have yard waste stickers will have to use all their Waste Management stickers by May 31st. Lakeshore Recycling Systems will issue new stickers to retailers prior to June 1st. Residents who already paid Waste Management for the yard waste subscription were charged a prorated rate. Their yard waste subscription will transfer to LRS and they will be charged a prorated rate.

What if my cart does not get delivered, I receive the wrong size, or want a different cart after the delivery takes place?

Although cart deliveries in the Village will begin on May 20th, not all homes will receive 1, 2 or more carts requested on the same day or at the same time. Different trucks will have certain sizes and styles on them. All homes should have a trash container by the first day of service by June 1st. If you do not have your new cart by June 1st, have the wrong cart or want a different size, you should call LRS at 844-633-3577 or contact them at <u>Service@LRSrecycles.com</u>

What types of waste and recycling will the new hauler collect? LRS will take everything that Waste Management picked up. With the addition of white good service such as washing machines, freezers and refrigerators for a service charge.

SERVICE ANNOUNCEMENTS AND SEASONAL REMINDERS

2023 WATER QUALITY REPORT NOW AVAILABLE

The Village has published its annual Water Quality Consumer Confidence Report at <u>www.gurnee.il.us/2023waterquality</u>. This report gives customers an understanding of the source of the Village's water, how our water is treated and the regulated compounds it contains, as well as the levels of these compounds and minerals.

BACKFLOW DEVICE TESTING

Residents with in-ground lawn irrigation systems are required to have backflow prevention devices installed on them. These devices protect you and the public water supply from possible contamination from hazardous chemicals or solvents that could come in contact with an underground irrigation system. These backflow devices must be properly maintained and tested annually by a licensed plumbing contractor certified to perform this type of work. Not only does this protect the safety of the public water supply, but it is also the law in Illinois. Please do your part and have your device maintained and tested annually.

SENIOR HOMEOWNER WATER RATE DISCOUNT PROGRAM

The Senior Homeowner Water Rate Discount Program automatically enrolls qualified seniors in a discounted rate for the first 7,000 gallons of water used during a two-month billing period. To qualify for the discount program, a senior must be receiving the Senior Homestead Exemption on their property tax bill and have a separate water meter (not billed to a Homeowner's Association). Seniors receiving this discount will continue to receive it and new seniors that qualify for it will have it applied on their water bill that will be arriving after the 2nd week of June.

The Village receives a list of properties receiving the Senior Homestead Exemption from Lake County and has a record of separately billed meters in our billing system. Therefore, seniors will be automatically enrolled if qualified and will not need to apply or take further action.

SAY NO TO PANHANDLING AND CONTRIBUTE TO THE SOLUTION

With the warm weather here, you may have noticed panhandlers throughout the surrounding communities as well as the Village. We encourage you to not give money to panhandlers and to instead contribute to the solution by:

- •Referring panhandlers or anyone you see who may be in need to United Way Lake County's 2-1-1 program. They have a wide-range of services and housing resources and can be reached by dialing 2-1-1 at any time to connect with services that help those in need.
- •Contacting PADS Lake County at 847-616-5557. PADS will send one of its outreach staff to determine what services may be needed.
- •Consider making a donation or volunteering for United Way's 2-1-1 Lake County, which is dedicated to assisting Lake County residents.

OUTDOOR SIRENS

Summer weather means an increased chance of tornado warnings. The Village has twelve outdoor sirens to warn residents to move indoors and seek shelter in the event of a tornado warning. This siren is only activated when the National Weather Service issues a tornado warning for Gurnee. The outdoor warning system will sound a VOICE MESSAGE ONLY. In the event of a tornado warning, the system will sound a VOICE MESSAGE & SIREN.

Note: The siren system is intended to be heard only while outdoors. Indoor warnings are relayed through television and radio. During severe weather, additional information can be received by tuning your radio to WKRS 1220 AM or STAR 102.3 FM. When the sirens are activated, residents should NOT call 911 and just seek shelter and monitor local emergency broadcast stations. The outdoor siren system is tested monthly on the first Tuesday at 10:00am. For a list of siren locations and more info, visit <u>www.gurnee.il.us/outdoorsirens</u>.

CALL BEFORE YOU DIG

No matter if your project is large or small, Illinois law requires anyone digging to call the Joint Utility Locating Information for Excavators (J.U.L.I.E.) hotline at least two working days prior to the start of excavation in order to locate and mark any utilities in the area in which you are working.
