COMMUNITY SPOTLIGHT: WELCOME COMFORT CANINE MIRA

The Gurnee Police Department is proud to introduce its newest team member, Mira Joy, a ninemonth-old Labrador Retriever who will serve as the department's comfort canine. Mira was generously donated to the Village of Gurnee by Partners with Paws Service Dogs, a nonprofit organization that provides trained service and comfort dogs for communities. To select Mira's name, Gurnee Police Department employees participated in a department-wide survey, ultimately choosing "Mira Joy" for her name. Her name means wonder, peace and happiness. She will be going by the name Mira as she begins her new role with the department. Mira will undergo 16 weeks of training and continue towards her American Kennel Club Canine Good Citizen certification, ensuring she is well prepared for her duties. Once certified, Mira will provide comfort and emotional support during traumatic incidents, interact with students and staff at local schools and strengthen community relationships through public engagement and outreach. Mira's handler is Chad Smits, the department's Public Education Specialist. Smits is a former Gurnee Police Officer with 16 years of service, including time as a School Resource Officer. His background in law enforcement, education, and community engagement makes him an ideal handler for Mira as she begins her journey with the department.

The Village's contractor, Peter Baker & Sons Inc., will be resurfacing 8.75 miles of roadway as well as completing pavement patching and curb and sidewalk repairs. The following streets will be resurfaced this year:

The public should expect lane, sidewalk and temporary driveway closures throughout this project.



<u>Street Reconstruction Program (May - September)</u>

The Village's contractor, Campanella & Sons, Inc., will be reconstructing Glen Flora Ave., West End to Estes Ave., Blackburn St., Rte. 41 to Glen Flora Ave. and Ferndale St., Rte. 41 to Glen Flora Ave. Additionally, drainage and sidewalk improvements will take place. Temporary lane, sidewalk and driveway closures are expected.

Stoney Island Water Main Replacement (May - August)

The Village's contractor, Campanella and Sons Inc., will be replacing the water main, hydrants and valve vaults on First St. and Delany Rd. from Blackstone Ave. to Bennett Ave., Stoney Island Ave., Lake Park Ave., and Bennett Ave. from First St. to Delany Rd. Lane and driveway closures as well as temporary water main shutdowns should be expected.

Quality Acres Sanitary Sewer Extension (May - August)

The Village's Contractor, Campanella & Sons, Inc., will be extending sanitary sewer westward along Woodhill Dr. from Dilley's Rd., with additional extensions south to each cul-de-sac on Bough Ct., Limb Ct., and Branch Rd., with a total project length of 2,100 linear ft.

Sidewalk Replacement Program (May - September)

The Village's contractor, Schroeder & Schroeder Inc. will be carrying out the annual Sidewalk Replacement Program for sidewalks that meet the criteria for replacement in the general area east of I-94 from Washington St. north along Rt. 21 to the Village's northern limits. The contractor will be providing door hangers to residents who will lose access to their driveways prior to the work beginning. This project will have minor impacts such as temporary lane and sidewalk closures.

Depot Road Retaining Wall Replacement (Start TBD)

The Village's contractor, Landscaping by Gary Weiss, will be replacing the 125 ft. long retaining wall at the northeast corner of Old Grand Ave. and Depot Rd.

SERVICE ANNOUNCEMENTS AND SEASONAL REMINDERS

GET STARTED WITH THE HEFTY RENEW PROGRAM

The Village of Gurnee, in partnership with Hefty, SWALCO and LRS, has launched the Hefty ReNew "orange" Bag Program. Jewel, Menards, Ace Hardware and participating retailers carry orange ReNew Bags. Residents can simply put their plastics that are not accepted in recycling into these orange ReNew bags and then place in their recycling container. These plastics include Styrofoam, food storage bags, candy/bar wrappers, chip bags, bubble wrap, packing peanuts and more. BACKFLOW DEVICE TESTING

Residents with in-ground lawn irrigation systems are required to have backflow prevention devices installed on them. These devices protect you and the public water supply from possible contamination from hazardous chemicals or solvents that could come in contact with an underground irrigation system. These backflow devices must be properly maintained and tested annually by a licensed plumbing contractor certified to perform this type of work. Not only does this protect the safety of the public water supply, but it is also the law in Illinois. Please do your part and have your device maintained and tested annually.

SAY NO TO PANHANDLING AND CONTRIBUTE TO THE SOLUTION

With the warm weather here, you may have noticed panhandlers throughout the surrounding communities as well as the Village. We encourage you to not give money to panhandlers and to instead contribute to the solution by:

OUTDOOR SIRENS

Summer weather means an increased chance of tornado warnings. The Village has twelve outdoor sirens to warn residents to move indoors and seek shelter in the event of a tornado warning. This siren is only activated when the National Weather Service issues a tornado warning for Gurnee. In the event of a tornado warning, the system will sound a VOICE MESSAGE & SIREN. Note: The siren system is intended to be heard only while outdoors. Indoor warnings are relayed through television and radio. During severe weather, additional information can be received by tuning your radio to WKRS 1220 AM or STAR 102.3 FM. When the sirens are activated, residents should NOT call 911 and just seek shelter and monitor local emergency broadcast stations. The outdoor siren system is tested monthly on the first Tuesday at 10:00am. For a list of siren locations and more information, please visit www.gurnee.il.us/outdoorsirens.

CALL BEFORE YOU DIG

No matter if your project is large or small, Illinois law requires anyone digging to call the Joint Utility Locating Information for Excavators (J.U.L.I.E.) hotline at least two working days prior to the start of excavation in order to locate and mark any utilities in the area in which you are working. The J.U.L.I.E. hotline can be reached at 800-892-0123 or 8-1-1, 24 hours a day. Requests may be submitted online at illinois1call.com.
