


ANNUAL CHAMBER BUSINESS LUNCHEON

VILLAGE BOARD ESTABLISHES THE GURNEE ARTS COMMISSION

At the October 6th Village Board Meeting, the Mayor and Village Board approved the new Gurnee Arts Commission and its members. Co-chairs Lynn Granstrom and Beth Keslinke will lead the commission. Beth, an art teacher at Warren Township High School, brings expertise in youth participation and supports public art initiatives. Lynn, a graphic designer and Chamber of Commerce Executive Director, brings her background in visual arts and community collaboration. The commission is made up of individuals with a range of artistic backgrounds and interests, and together they are eager to collaborate on art initiatives, events and opportunities that will enrich Gurnee.





COMMUNITY SPOTLIGHT: ALLEN LYNCH

Allen J. Lynch, Village of Gurnee resident, served in the 12th Cavalry Regiment, 1st Cavalry Division (Airmobile) from May 1967 until June 1968 during Vietnam. He had been "in-country" for six months when the action took place that would result in him receiving the Medal of Honor. The recognition of his conspicuous gallantry and selfless service to others on that day would be the catalyst for a life of service to others. Lynch was awarded the Medal of Honor by President Richard Nixon on May 14th, 1970 in a ceremony at the White House. Since receiving the Medal, Allen has continued to serve his fellow veterans. He served as a Veterans Benefits Counselor and later Chief of Ambulatory Care with the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs. He then served as the Executive Director of the Vietnam Veterans Leadership Program in Illinois. He left that position in 1985 to become the Chief of the Military and Veterans Rights Bureau with the Illinois Attorney General's office, retiring in 2005. He also served with the US Army Reserve and the Illinois National Guard until his retirement with 21 years of service in 1994. Allen and his wife, Susan, have three children and are now blessed with 4 grandchildren. On Monday, November 3rd, Allen was honored by the Mayor, Trustees and the community. The recognition included the unveiling of a bronze plaque to be installed at the Veterans Memorial in front of the Police Station.

SERVICE ANNOUNCEMENTS AND SEASONAL REMINDERS

GURNEE'S SNOW AND ICE CONTROL



With the onset of the winter season, the Gurnee Public Works Department would like to offer the following information to keep in mind as snow plowing operations begin.

Village plowing operations commence when the snow begins to accumulate and temperatures indicate that no melting will occur. The Village plows only municipally-owned streets. The Village of Gurnee is bisected by a number of State of Illinois and Lake County arterial highways which are not maintained/plowed by the Village. Routes 132, 120, 45, 41 and 21 are plowed and maintained by the Illinois Department of Transportation (IDOT). Hunt Club, Washington, O'Plaine, Greenleaf (south of Washington), Dilley's (north of Rt. 132),

Gages Lake, Delany (north of Rt. 41), Sunset and Stearns School are plowed and maintained by the Lake County Division of Transportation (LCDOT).

The following tips help ensure snow and ice control operations proceed smoothly:

- 1. When clearing sidewalks and driveways, do not shovel, blow or plow snow onto the roadway.
- 2. When it starts to snow, park your vehicle off of the street.
- 3. Please try to clear the snow around fire hydrants. This simple step could save precious time during an emergency.
- 4. Please remove portable basketball hoops, benches and decor from the street right-of-way. The Village is not responsible for damage to these items resulting from our snow removal operations.
- 5. To minimize snow deposits at the end of your driveway, try not to create large piles of snow in the parkway on the upstream side. While it's frustrating to shovel your driveway only to have the plow come by and push snow back at the base, it is not feasible to plow the street so that your driveway remains completely "snow free." Roadway design, the type of equipment that is utilized and the severity of snow events all factor into the size of the windrow left in the plow's wake.

REUSE-A-SHOE COLLECTION BIN AT PUBLIC WORKS FACILITY

The Reuse-A-Shoe Collection at the Gurnee Public Works Facility located at 1151 Kilbourne Ave. is available daily for drop-off anytime. Here are some important things to remember: All types, sizes and brands are accepted. If a pair, please keep shoes paired by tying, banding, or bagging them together. NOT ACCEPTED items include but are not limited to ice skates, rollerblades, winter boots, moldy shoes or badly damaged shoes. By using this reuse bin, you're helping reduce waste and contributing to a greener Gurnee!

CHRISTMAS TREE PICK UP BEGINS FRIDAY, JANUARY 2

Lakeshore Recycling Systems will be collecting Christmas trees on your regular service day throughout the month of January. In order for a tree to be collected, it must be placed at the curb or the edge of the street by 6:00am on the pick-up day. All lights and decorations must be removed. Failure to remove decorations or placing the tree in a plastic bag will result in the tree not being collected that week and the resident will have to wait until the following week.

Please note that only real trees are accepted. If a Christmas tree is greater than 6 ft., it must be cut in half in order for LRS to pick it up. Trees placed out after your final collection for January will not be picked up.



HOLIDAY REMINDER: WASTE COLLECTION AND OFFICE CLOSURE

Due to the Christmas Holiday and New Year's Day, if your garbage and recycling falls on or after Thursday, December 25th (Christmas Day) or Thursday, January 1st (New Year's Day) then your collection will be delayed by one day for that week. Also, Village offices will be closed on December 24th and 25th (Christmas Eve and Christmas Day) as well as on January 1st (New Year's Day).

WINTER HOME MAINTENANCE TIPS

Winter is on its way! It is important to protect the interior and exterior of your property from the cold weather. The following tips can help prepare your home for the winter season.

Protect Pipes: Maintain a consistent temperature of at least 60°F in all areas of your home, and properly seal all possible entry points from outdoor air to prevent freezing of water pipes.

Furnace Maintenance: Have an HVAC professional test and service your furnace annually to ensure all components are functioning properly.

Fireplace Maintenance: Before using your fireplace for the first time this season, thoroughly clean it by removing soot and debris from the firebox and chimney.

If your fireplace needs maintenance and/or repair, consult with a chimney sweeper or fireplace service technician.
