Communications Statistics

May 2019 June 2019 July 2019

Brunell highlighted these statistics show the busiest part of the year. Gurnee Police is up 10% and Zion Police is down 10%. Call volume is consistent and the fire side for all agencies remains consistent with numbers.

9-1-1 Answering Equipment / Trunks / MSAG

The regional 9-1-1 group met and spoke about standardizing on Solacom equipment. It is not definite at this point but the discussion centered around a 3 year window for it. At 3 years, we would be about 7 years into our current equipment.

Illinois NG9-1-1 Implementation

Nothing new to report since the last meeting.

Emergency Medical Dispatch (EMD)

Priority Dispatch Pro QA Medical Software Project

The first round of on-site meetings is happening this week for 3 days. Installation is scheduled for October and go-live by the end of the year. Staff is trying to get this done by the end of the year due to a staff member at PSSI/Central Square retiring after December.

CAD System

Tritech ProQA Paramount Interface EMD

Discussion has been made with Central Square/PSSI in lining up their staff for this implementation.

Radio Systems

Quad 1 & Gurnee Fire Radio System Implementation Zion Police Station Radio Gateway Zion Police UHF System Operation

The repeater at Beach Park water tower is installed and active. Adjustments are being made to the equipment for quality. Coordination between North Chicago, Mundelein and Winthrop Harbor is ongoing in reference to shared frequencies.

The radio gateway at the Zion Police station has been operational for approximately 60 days. This has had a positive effect on siren activation. It has also made some additional secondary channels available to the consoles in dispatch.

Regarding Zion Police UHF, Chief Henderson advised it seems the issues they are seeing lately are weather related. The last interruption they had Radicom go back and look through the logs for anything. They were unable to locate anything with the equipment. The goal would be to move off of this system and on to Starcom21. This would most likely take the next 2 years to implement. Discussion was made previously with the state 9-1-1 Coordinator in reference to ETSB Funds and Starcom21. It appears that the monthly recurring costs would not be eligible but the initial purchase of equipment may be. It was suggested to include this in the budget committee discussions.

Work is scheduled for August 16th to work on final alignment and management setup pending no inclement weather.

Altorfer Power Systems – Generator Load Test and PM Results

Tests were performed that took the generator above the loads we typically would get to. Chairman Velkover thanked John Petersen for his work regarding coordination of the testing. The test went very well and everything passed with flying colors.

We continue to be heavily involved in this process and Phil Brunell is involved in the RFP process. The committee members ranked the consultants proposals, will sit through their presentations and then select an agency.

Consideration of Proposal for Northwestern Water Tower Generator, Pieper Power, ETSB share \$14,675

Chairman Velkover advised the Gurnee Public Works division put this proposal together and it would be a shared cost. This site is a relay point for the microwave connection to Zion and a receive site for PD and FD radio systems. A similar project was done at the Pembrook water tower several years ago. Two bids were received and the lower was selected from Pieper Power, which is the same company that did the Pembrook generator.
