### **G. NEW BUSINESS**

 Approval of Ord. 2017 - 15 authorizing the transfer of funds from the General Fund to the Capital Improvement Fund and Water & Sewer Capital Improvement Fund.

Mr. Muetz said there is some projected surplus at the end of FY 16/17 in the General Fund. As you discussed and included in the proposed budget, staff is recommending the transfer of \$750,000 from the General Fund to the Capital Improvement Fund and \$200,000 from the General Fund to the Water & Sewer Capital Improvement Fund. The transfer of FY 16/17 surplus will be used to support FY 17/18 projects. As it was not included in the 16/17 Approved Budget, it's prudent to memorialize the transfer via an ordinance.

 Approval of Ord. 2017 - 17 authorizing the Third Amendment to the agreement between the Northern Illinois Municipal Electric Collaborative (NIMEC) and the Village of Gurnee for consulting services regarding an Electricity Aggregation Program.

Mr. Muetz said in 2012 and again in 2013 the Village entered into an agreement with NIMEC to assist us with our community-wide electrical aggregation program. NIMEC prequalified suppliers, bid accounts and provided program administration support to staff. With another round of bidding on the horizon as the electrical contract is set to expire in April, staff is recommending the Village once again contract with NIMEC. Mr. Muetz said the contract remains unchanged from the previous agreement, with the exception of the term, which is simply extended to make the expiration date June 1, 2017. Once staff receives and reviews bids, it will be back before the Village Board with a recommendation as to whether to enter and agreement with a new supplier or to revert back to Com Ed.

Mayor Kovarik asked if we still have a claw back provision.

Mr. Linehan stated the Village renegotiated the third year of its contact with First Energy, where it matched the Com Ed rate.

Mayor Kovarik said the shorter the contract the better for the residents.

Mr. Linehan said as of late most communities are entering one year contracts.

4. Approval of awarding the 2017 Network Equipment Project to the low bidder, CDW-G, at a cost of \$152,019.16.

Mr. Muetz said included in the FY 17/18 Budget is funding for network improvements which support dispatch consolidation, as well as the Village's IT infrastructure. The equipment requested in the RFP has been categorized into five major categories: Gurnee/Zion Consolidation, Gurnee Switching, Gurnee Firewall, IP Phone Sets and SCADA Router. Each category include multiple components

which have been specifically identified by IS staff. The Information Systems went out for bid for this equipment on March 10th, with responses due March 24th. The Village received two response to the request. Following the opening and review of proposals, staff is recommending the equipment be purchased from CDW-G. CDW-G was substantially less in terms of cost and was \$25,000 under what staff included in the budget. In addition, the Village has purchased from CDW-G in the past and has always been very pleased with the interaction and equipment.

Mr. Muetz said the next six items on the agenda are similar in nature and he will summarize them at once. Included in the FY 17/18 Budget is funding for the replacement of two big plow trucks. These trucks are not available on State bid, however staff did obtain National Joint Power Alliance (NJPA) pricing. JX Peterbilt was able to beat the pricing.

Similarly, Item #9 on the agenda is the one ton chassis in the FY 17/18 Approved Budget. Again, staff received NJPA pricing, which a local dealer was able to beat.

He continued to say staff is requesting to continue to work with Bonnell Industries to outfit the trucks. The Village has had great success with the equipment provided. The large trucks will have hooklift systems installed to increase versatility. The larger trucks will also be held onto until staff has a better feel for the size of the capital transfer at the end of FY 17/18. The one tons will be auctioned.

Mayor Kovarik asked if the large trucks to be replaced are the first to be replaced about this being under the improved Fleet Management program.

Mr. Muetz said no, one is a 2000 and one is a 2001. The improved Fleet Management program began in 2009.
