

- Share alerts, photos and videos with neighbors
- Gurnee Police can send notifications about recent crime
- Gurnee Police CANNOT watch "live-stream" videos
- You can share videos with Gurnee Police for investigation


Uniform Crime Reporting (UCR)

Taking your hands off of the wheel to change stations, looking at the navigation system, or manipulating the temperature


Visual Distractions

HOW CAN YOU AVOID DISTRACTED DRIVING?

Electronics

Don't look at your phone while driving. Put your cellphone on "Do Not Disturb While Driving"

Family Members

Secure children and pets before driving.

If they need attention, pull over to the side of the road

<u>Passengers</u>

Conversations with passengers should be light in topic.
Reserve serious discussions for another time

Eating

Life is busy.
Schedule meal
times either before
or after driving, not
while driving

CURRENT ILLINOIS LAW

What to know before you drive distracted

NEW LAW AS OF JULY 1, 2019

Drivers caught texting while driving will receive a moving violation. With 3 or more moving citations (speeding, texting, etc.) your license may be suspended.

HAND-HELD DEVICES PROHIBITED

All drivers must be hands free while in a moving vehicle. Hands-free devices are only allowed for drivers 19 years or older.

ELECTRONIC DEVICES ALLOWED

In an emergency situation
When you are pulled over on the side of the road
When your vehicle is in park

Additional Patrols

Officers know the dangers associated with driving distracted. Citations are being issued when violations are witnessed.

Several annual grants are dedicated to distracted driving - April is distracted driving month.

Education

We are spreading the word about the risks of distracted driving and making drivers aware of their driving habits.

We need your help! Educate your family and friends about the dangers of driving distracted.

Aggressive Driving

Operation of a motor vehicle in a manner that endangers or is likely to endanger others or property.

Examples

Yelling or throwing objects

Slamming on the breaks in front of a tailgater

Passing on the shoulder

Repeatedly honking/flashing lights

Cutting off another vehicle

Speeding / Tailgating

DON'T ENGAGE THE DRIVER

Do not retaliate. Engaging the driver may escalate the situation

GET OUT OF THE WAY

When safe to do so, move out of the way and allow the driver to pass. Set an example of a safe driver

DON'T UNDERESTIMATE THEIR POTENTIAL


Aggressive drivers often try to engage and intimidate other drivers. Do not make eye contact. Continue to drive safely to your destination.

Contact police if you fear you are in danger

RULES YOU CAN APPLY TO YOUR OWN ENCOUNTERS

TIPS TO AVOID A SPAM CALL



DO NOT ANSWER THE PHONE

Disregard numbers you do not know If It's important, they will leave a message

DO NOT MAKE PAYMENT OVER THE PHONE

Callers will attempt to scare you into giving money

Never provide personal information

NATIONAL DO NOT CALL REGISTRY

Registering your phone number is free Federal Trade Commission Website:

HOW CELLPHONE COMPANIES ARE HELPING YOU

T-MOBILE

Automatically filters spam calls for subscribers.

Spam calls do not come through to the cellphone user.

But, it cannot stop all spam calls.

SPRINT & VERIZON


Offers an "Opt-In" version of spam filtering. Subscribers must download an app to avoid receiving spam calls.

In the App Store:

- Sprint's App Sprint Call Screener
- Verizon's App Verizon Call Filter

AT&T

Fraud Blocker was automatically added for subscribers.



Each provider offers a fee based version with more options.

These are available in the App Store.

Things to remember about spam calls

Spoofing

Although a phone number will appear on the caller ID, it's likely the number is fake.

Don't Answer

If you don't recognize the number DON'T ANSWER!

If it is an important call, they will leave a message.

Government Calls

Calls directly from the police or other government agencies will not ask for money over the phone.

Skeptical?

Tell the caller you will call them back.
Hang up and call a known working number for the organization.
